

Water Supply for a Hill Tribe Village

One of the main problems that hill tribes face in the mountains of northern Thailand is the lack of water. During the dry season most people get their water from lakes or rivers, that are often far from their homes, spending a lot of time and energy to do so. The villagers spend most of their day carrying water, and therefore they are not able to irrigate and grow their own vegetables and fruits in their village or community.



The Rain Tree Foundation aims to provide the villagers with access to a sufficient amount of water for their daily needs and to make it possible to conduct successful farming.



Ram Pumps pump water to the village homes providing a steady water supply for households and all other water based purposes.

Ram Pumps use downhill water pressure to pump water to higher areas, with no other power source needed. They are also easy to install, easy to maintain and they have a long life cycle.

The village of Mae Ki Moo Noi is situated north west of Chiang Mai, in the mountains. Most of the villagers live in very poor conditions; they have little financial income, and little chances to prosper. They have very difficult access to water sources, especially during the dry season.



With a donation of 7,000€ you could help us build a water pump system that would provide the whole village with water supply all year around, not only for personal needs, but for being able to create an income through successful farming.

We have already installed more than 20 water supply systems in the rural areas of Northern Thailand, with very positive results, helping the villagers on an everyday basis, and improving their life quality substantially.
